Official Absentee Ballot for the General Election - November 8, 2022

Instructions

1. Mark the oval to the left of the name of your choice.
2. To vote for a candidate whose name is not printed on the ballot, print the name clearly in the box labeled "Write-In", staying within the box.
3. Any mark or writing outside the spaces provided for voting may void the entire ballot.
4. To vote on a question or proposal, mark the oval below your choice.

5. You have a right to a replacement ballot. If you make a mistake or want to change your vote, call the County Board of Elections for instructions on how to obtain a new ballot.
6. The number of choices is listed for each contest.
7. Do not mark the ballot for more candidates than allowed. If you do, your vote in that contest will not count.
8. To be counted, absentee ballots returned by mail must be postmarked by the day of the election and be received by the County Board of Elections no later than 7 days after election day.

9. After marking the ballot, fold such ballot and enclose it in the envelope bearing the voter's statement, and seal the envelope.
10. Fill in properly the blanks in the statement and sign your name.
11. Enclose the sealed envelope bearing the statement in the envelope addressed to the County Board of Elections and mail promptly.
